Popular part-time jobs for students in Australia include roles in hospitality, retail and tourism. You can even find paid internships and work experience opportunities through your university.

If you stay in Australia after graduation, you'll have the chance to launch your career in one of the country's fastest-growing cities. On the Gold Coast, industries such as tourism and construction are always strong, and the health and tech sectors are also seeing rapid growth.

Plus, if you're a student studying in the fields of health, technology, education and construction, you may also be eligible for a further extension of your post-study working rights!

The city's fantastic public transport system makes getting around very easy. There's no shortage of buses, trains and trams to get you where you need to go, and the network usually runs on time.

Plus, you can even use public transport to take day or overnight trips to other destinations, such as Brisbane, Byron Bay and small coastal towns like Yamba.
